
Lied Public Library 2009 Annual Report

More than 48,000 visitors came to the Lied Public Library and over 20,000 people logged on to our website and they discovered that the library contains vast resources, exciting new technology, and is quite entertaining.

Here at the Lied Public Library we educate and celebrate lifelong learning. We offer great programs and education for all ages: the central role of a public library and a role that only a public library can fill in a community.

In an average week of 2009, the Lied Public Library...

- Welcomes 930 visitors
- Circulates over 1557 items (nearly 259 per day)
- Answers over 38 questions
- Provides computer use to nearly 259 customers
- Adds 63 items to the Library's collection
- Issues 8 new borrower's cards
- Receives 391 hits on the Library's website
- Processes over 18 requests from customers and libraries for interlibrary loan materials

The library is a relevant, open and vibrant place where people of all ages are welcomed to gather to enrich their own and others lives.







Highlights of 2009

January: The library received a gift from the Bossingham Foundation in the amount of \$500.00 for the audiobook collection. The library provided a meeting space for U.S. Census testing for the 2010 census. Library staff and trustees also reviewed and updated all library policies. Library staff and trustees also reviewed the library's long range plan and mission and extended the plan for an additional two more years.



March: The library hosted its second annual Quilt Day in which over 20 quilters came to the library to display and encourage quilting in the community. The Friends of the Lied Public Library also hosted their semi-annual book sale. David and Coreen Williams donated a signed print to the library for display in the children's department. The Library received a grant from the Fremont, Page, and Taylor Decatorgization Board in the amount of \$400.00 for Story Hour and Book Babies programming.

2009 Youth Art Show Showcased over 714 items

April: The library participated in another successful National Library Week celebration, events which included a library clean-up day, fine free week, and extra computer time. The Friends of the Library provide gifts to hand out.

May: Library was awarded reaccreditation for another three years at tier 3, the highest possible level. The library's 5 year old computer network server was replaced with a new state of the art server.

June-August: The library's annual summer reading program was another success with over 210 registrations and a total attendance of 1,692 people at 42 programs The library adopted policies to comply with Iowa's updated sex offender law. The library also added a baby changing station in the family restroom located in the children's department. The library received a gift in the amount of \$500.00 from the New Life Assembly of God. The library also had all the trees trimmed and the sidewalks repaired and modifications made to the handicapped parking stall. The Friends of the Library hosted another successful Book Sale raising over \$1,000.00.




Clowning Around @ Your Library

September: The library offered free replacement library cards to those who may have lost or damaged their card.

October: The Fall Festival was held following the Ghost Walk with over 18 different crafts, games, and activities for the 350+ participants to enjoy. The Lied Public Library Foundation provided a free will donation lunch.

November: The Library received a grant in the amount of \$2,000.00 from the Page County Community Foundation to start and develop a downloadable audiobook collection.

789.29 hours of their time to help at the library.


During the year staff cataloged, stamped, stickered, and readied 3,294 new items for the public to use and withdrew 3,871 outdated or dam-

aged items.

From home or office computers patrons visited the library's website 20,617 times and logged on the library's database over 990 times.
