## **Behavior Policy**

The Lied Public Library patrons are expected to observe the rights of other patrons and staff members. Patrons are also asked to use the library for its intended purposes.

- The Staff has the responsibility for enforcing discipline within the library.
- The Staff determines when behavior is inappropriate in the library.
- Response to inappropriate behavior should be immediate.

Inappropriate behavior will not be allowed on library grounds, which may include, but not limited to the following:

- o Any behavior that endangers the safety or health of others.
- o Violation of any local, state or federal law within the library.
- o Vandalism or deliberate destruction of library material.
- o Theft of library materials or the personal property of other patrons or staff members.
- o Deliberate disruption of library procedures or operation.
- o Use of abusive language at other patrons or the staff.
- o Loud talking or laughing, that disturbs or could disturb other patrons.
- o Inappropriate dress; e.g. no shirt or shoes.
- o Smoking, alcohol, chewing tobacco or illegal drugs in the library.
- The use of cellular telephones within library that is disruptive.
- o Unattended children (see policy).
- o Pets. (Unless assisting those with disabilities).
- O Skates, skateboards, in-line skates and similar products inside and on library grounds.
- Other kinds of behavior deemed inappropriate by the staff.
- o Impeding access to library or library materials.
- o Use of audio devices without headphones or at an unreasonable level.
- o Parking bicycles anywhere other than provided bicycles racks.
- o Refusing to comply with directive of library staff.

## **Procedure:**

- Warning. In most cases, patrons who are behaving inappropriately in the library will be given a verbal warning and asked to behave in an appropriate manner.
- Expulsion. Patrons who refuse to behave more appropriately after one warning will be asked to leave the library.
  - o Expulsion may result in suspended use of the library for a given length of time
- Calling the Police. In cases where patrons pose a clear danger to themselves or others or where there is a deliberate violation of the law, or refusal to leave the library after being asked by the Staff, the Staff is authorized to call the police.
