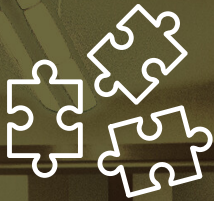

Besides the Summer Library Programs the library also host many special programs and events.

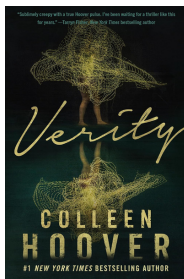


The library added a photo printing kiosk from a local businesses which was closing.

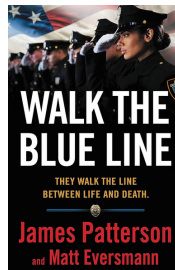

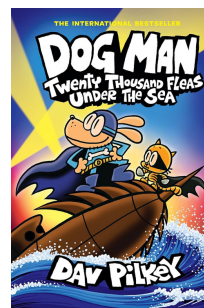
